### **Discussion Questions**

- In her book Kimmerer expressed frustration and anger that her family could not speak the Potawatomi language or use the true names that were lost to them. They were forced to use the language of exiles when offering prayers and ceremonies. As she grew older, she "recognized that the earth drank it up as if it were right. The land knows you, even when you are lost." What do you think Kimmerer meant by this?
- Kimmerer's graduate student, Laurie, completed a research project on sweetgrass that was based on Indigenous knowledge. Initially it received pushback from the faculty



committee because it was seen as unscientific and not supported by academia. Why do you think this was the case?

- The Honorable Harvest is explained as the Indigenous principles and practices that focus on reciprocity and sustainability. In what ways can this be applied to other aspects of life?
- Kimmerer mentions that many Native peoples around the world are rooted in cultures of gratitude. They recognize and are thankful for what they are given from nature and the world. Gratitude can be given by offerings, ceremonies, songs, and other forms of recognition. What forms of gratitude do you participate in?
- How did your perspective about plants change after reading Braiding Sweetgrass?
