Aboriginal art is made by indigenous people from Australia, also known as Australian Aboriginals. It is made using different art mediums, including painting on leaves, wood carving, rock carving, sculpting, ceremonial clothing, and sand painting. Aboriginal art is closely linked to religious ceremonies or rituals. It is an important part of the world's oldest continuous cultural tradition, based on totems and Aboriginal spiritual philosophy, known as the Dreaming. All the designs have a story behind them.

Symbols are used in aboriginal art, to express ideas. Many times, the symbolism changes within the same piece, and can differ between groups. Aboriginal art is a language that uses beautiful patterns to express ideas and meaning. It can date back as far as 30 to 40 thousand years.
