

Glossary

AFAB/AMAB Assigned Female (or Male) At Birth. These terms group together cisgendered, nonbinary and gender-diverse individuals based on their sex assigned at birth.

Deadnaming Refers to instances when an individual, intentionally or unintentionally, uses a name a gender expansive individual answered to in the past, but no longer uses.

Enby An informal abbreviation of the term Nonbinary.

Genderqueer Refers to individuals who blur preconceived notions of gender in their appearance and lifestyle.

Hijra A gender category of Southeast Asia comprised of AMAB individuals who take on the dress and social roles of women, but do not necessarily identify as women. They are a social caste referenced in Hindu texts dating back to 400 BCE and continue to fulfill important spiritual and social roles in the modern day.

Kaúxuma Núpika (c. 1780-1837) Kutenai warrior, prophet, guide and gender expansive individual. Unlike two spirit Natives, Kaúxuma Núpika whom modern, non-Native, historians have described as a trans man, did not embody the traits and take on the traditional roles of both genders. According to European and Native accounts, Kaúxuma Núpika dressed, lived, and identified exclusively as a man.

Mahu A kanaka maoli (Native Hawaiian) who embodies both masculine and feminine traits and takes on the traditional roles of both genders.

Marcia P Johnson (1945-1992) African American LGBTQ activist known for her role in the Stonewall Uprising. She advocated for the humane treatment of LGBTQ individuals through her work with the Gay Liberation Front and Street Transvestites Action Revolutionaries among other groups.

Mashoga A Swahili term encompassing a range of gender identities, primarily describing AMAB individuals who take on traditionally feminine dress and social roles.

Muxe A third gender category in the Zapotec indigenous culture of Mexico. The muxe is defined by their adherence to traditionally feminine gender roles and traits. While some muxes consider themselves trans, or more generally LGBTQ, not all of them do and the category of muxe doesn't correlate to any one sexual orientation.

Non-Binary An umbrella term for individuals who fall outside of the gender binary of man/woman, it describes those who identify as a mix of male and female or don't identify as either.

Sarah McBride (born 1990) Senator for Delaware since 2020 and LGBTQ rights activist. She is the first openly trans person to be elected to congress.

Stormé DeLarverie (1920-2014) Performer and drag king known for their role in the Stonewall Uprising, most notably for being the first to resist their arrest and fight back against the police. DeLarverie was a prominent figure in the lesbian community. Described by the police as a "butch lesbian", they never publicly stated their gender but were described by close friends as having "lived as a man".

Sylvia Rivera (1951-2002) Latina LGBTQ activist known for her role in the Stonewall Uprising and her social justice work alongside Marcia P Johnson. Rivera was known for her outspoken advocacy for trans acceptance and recognition in the gay rights movements.

They/Them Gender neutral pronouns that may be used to refer to nonbinary individuals.

Trancestor An informal term of respect and admiration used by trans individuals to describe trans elders. This term celebrates intergenerational solidarity and bonds.

Trans The shortened version the word *transgender*, it describes a person whose gender identity does not correspond to their assigned sex at birth.

Two Spirit (abbreviated as 2S) A pan-indigenous term coined in 1990 by and for gender expansive indigenous people. It is a third gender category that describes people assigned either sex at birth who identify as embodying both male and female, regardless of their dress or lifestyle.
